

# Going Virtual: Evaluating Your Meeting



Part of doing any program is evaluation. National 4-H has created a simple tool that can be incorporated into any virtual meeting as a way to determine the effectiveness of programs. These evaluations can be administered through Zoom Polling, a digital survey (created in Qualtrics or Microsoft Forms — See county agent for help), or even a simple show of hands during a meeting. These Common Measures are being used across the United States to evaluate virtual meetings.
