



ARKANSAS 4-H GOVERNOR'S AWARD

The Arkansas 4-H Governor's Award was instituted in 1983 and was designed to recognize one outstanding Arkansas 4-H member each year. This award is available only to current or former State 4-H Record Book winners.

This prestigious award is based upon a current year's 4-H Record Book and the Governor's Award application. The finalists will each receive a \$1,000 scholarship. The Arkansas 4-H Governor's Award recipient is presented a \$3,000 scholarship and silver plate (pending funding).

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Former state record book winners will be considered in the selection process. The recipient of the Governor's Award must have had his/her 14th birthday and will be eligible to apply annually on February 1 until the year after their 19th birthday. For example, if a 4-H member has their 19th birthday on December 31 of the current year, they will be eligible to apply for the Governor's Award the following February 1 only. In order to receive the Governor's Award, he/she must complete the Governor's Award Report Form.
- 2. Record Books, with the Governor's Award Report Form and two letters of recommendation, are due in the state 4-H office on February 1. These materials are due prior to that date in the county Extension office.
- 4. Former state Record Book winners must submit an updated Record Book with the Governor's Award Report Form. The form should be paper clipped to the inside front cover of the binder. All other sections of the Record Book will remain the same as for state judging. The 4-H Record Book need only cover the years since the 4-H member was named a state Record Book winner but may include a 4-H'ers entire work.
- 5. All Record Books must show <u>significant</u> work in the <u>current</u> year. A 4-H'er may select any project eligible for state honors.
- 6. The recipient of the Governor's Award must never have been found in violation of the Arkansas 4-H Code of Conduct by the Review Board and suspended for any period of time from 4-H district and state activities and may receive this award only once. The winner will <u>not</u> be eligible to return to National 4-H Congress.

SELECTION PROCESS

The Governor's Award finalists will be selected by the state Record Book judging committee. The judging will take place the week of state Record Book judging. Criteria for selection includes:

Experiences and Accomplishments in 4-H Leadership	30%
Experiences and Accomplishments in 4-H Citizenship and Community Service	30%
Experiences and Accomplishments in 4-H Projects and Activities	25%
Contributions to the Overall 4-H Program	15%
