OVERVIEW

Staying abreast of new technology takes time and effort, especially if you don't own the newest gadget or gizmo, but no one wants to be left behind when it comes to knowing what it is all about. What better way to learn about new technology than to see it demonstrated up close and personal from your peers? The Innovative Technology event allows 4-H'ers to demonstrate their favorite electronic technology and give a quick overview of how it can be used.

Using the device of their choice, 4-H'ers can give an illustrated talk or method demonstration concerning some aspect of their favorite app, device, or software, sharing information such as the pros and cons, costs involved, privacy issues, benefits, impact, intended audience and even bugs!

OBJECTIVES

To give 4-H members a forum in which to showcase their knowledge of technology and the ways in which technology can impact our everyday life.

To provide an opportunity for 4-H members to practice using technology for problem-solving and decision- making.

ELIGIBILITY

<u>District 4-H O-Rama</u>: Each county may have two entry in the Junior Division (9-13) and two entry in the Senior Division (14-19). Entries are individuals only; no teams. <u>Arkansas 4-H O-Rama</u>: The top seven (7) seniors from each District 4-H O-Rama may participate.

ACTIVITY

All presentations must be original and it is suggested that participants provide a hard-copy of their presentation. A computer and projector will be provided. If the participants provide their own computer and/or electronic technology it is their responsibility and should not be left unattended in the room. Participants should arrive at least 10 minutes prior to the event to have their presentation copied to the Event Coordinators computer and or setup their computer/electronic technology. Internet accessibility is not guaranteed.

Juniors will be allowed two to five (2-5) minutes.

Seniors will be allowed five to eight (5-8) minutes.

NOTE: A scoring penalty will be administered to presentations which are under or over the allotted time.

Participants are expected to use visual aids (e.g., computers, tablets, phones, posters, models, props, PowerPoint slides).

JUDGING

This activity will be judged on the standard "Score Sheet for Method Demonstrations and Illustrated Talks" CES-663.

AWARDS

District 4-H O-Rama – One trophy to the senior winner and one trophy to the junior winner. Ribbons will be awarded to second-, third-, fourth-, and fifth-place senior and junior winners.

Arkansas 4-H O-Rama – One trophy for the senior winner. Ribbons will be awarded to the second-, third, fourth-, and fifth-place winners.
